Frequently Asked Questions

How do I know if I am eligible?

- Students can qualify for dual enrollment by taking one of the following assessments: PSAT, PLAN, EXPLORE ACT, or MME. Click <u>HERE</u> to access the Dual Enrollment Readiness Qualifying Assessments and Scores 2022-23
- Students must be enrolled in both the eligible school (public or private) and eligible postsecondary institution during the local school's regular academic year and must be enrolled in at least one high school class.



How do I enroll at St. Clair County Community College?

- Apply to SC4 <u>Fill out an application</u> today!
- Complete an Authorization Form The <u>authorization form</u> for High School Guest and Dual Enrollment students must be submitted to the high school counselor, Mrs. Krista McLeod at kmcleod@marysvilleschools.us

What courses can I take?

- A course not offered at MHS or a course not available to the student due to a scheduling conflict.
- The college course cannot be a hobby, craft, or recreation course, or in the subject areas of physical education, theology, divinity, or religious education.
- Course limits:
 - Up to 10 courses overall can be covered under the Postsecondary Enrollment Options Act. For a student that first dual enrolls in:
 - 9th grade not more than two courses per year in 9th, 10th, and 11th grade, and not more than four courses in grade 12
 - 10th grade not more than two courses in 10th grade, and not more than four courses in 11th and 12th grade
 - 11th or 12th grade not more than six courses per year
- SC4 is a member of the <u>Michigan Transfer Agreement (MTA)</u>, which simplifies the transfer of credit for SC4 students between community colleges, four-year public colleges, and some private colleges in Michigan.
- Always check with the university that you would like to transfer to regarding how classes transfer. <u>https://www.mitransfer.org/search-courses</u>
- Check <u>NCAA eligibility center</u> requirements if you are interested in playing sports in college.

Does the course count for high school credit?

• Postsecondary courses may be taken for high school credit, postsecondary credit, or both. A student makes this decision at the time of enrollment. When more than one course is being taken, a student may make different credit designations for each course.
