Dear Marysville Families and Community Members,

It is still uncertain when we will officially return to school, although the governor's tentative return date is currently Tuesday, April 14, 2020. Our state legislators were scheduled to return from their recess today, but they've made a informed decision to not reconvene until, at the earliest, Wednesday, April 1, 2020. Because of this, the legislature will be taking no action on the days that we've already missed for the 2019-20 academic year. Essentially, there are two possibilities that can be considered. The first is to forgive the days, as they did last year for the excessive amount of snow/cold days. Second, is for schools to make-up days. Presently, the legislature is unwilling to address this issue. It's their belief that the governor and state superintendent of public instruction have the discretion to choose what will happen; at this juncture, they haven't officially decided.

Playgrounds

As you may have noticed, the district has closed all its playgrounds and athletic facilities until further notice. Once the governor directs schools to reopen, the district will promptly remove the caution tape for public access.

Food Distribution

In response to the governor's mandatory COVID-19 closure of all schools in Michigan, the district will be providing "grab-and-go" meals for students age 18 and under. Grab-and-go meals will include both breakfast and lunch items for the week.
