5th Grade Reproductive Health and HIV Education

Goals:

- Students will learn and understand the developmental changes that occur during puberty.
- Students will understand the physical and emotional affects that HIV/AIDS have on the human body, as well as common STI's.

Objectives:

– Students will learn that males and females develop at different rates, and there are wide variations within each sex.

– Students will learn about social changes during puberty (e.g., changes in friendships, crushes/attractions, and changing expectations of parents/adults).

- Students will learn about emotional changes during puberty (e.g., mood shifts)

– Students will learn about the physical changes that occur during puberty (e.g., body hair, body odor, voice, body shape, strength, hormones, and menstruation).

– Students will be able to identify basic male and female reproductive anatomy using scientific names.

– Students will learn the functions of sperm and egg cells in human reproduction.

- Students will learn how sperm cells are produced.
- Students will learn about the menstrual cycle and its potential for human reproduction.
- Students will learn about the functions of basic male and female reproductive anatomy.

– Students will learn how culture, media, and others influence what one thinks about oneself and relationships, including puberty.

- Students will learn the definition of HIV and AIDS.

- Students will learn it is safe to be a friend of someone who is living with HIV or AIDS.

- Students will learn how HIV is and is not transmitted.

– Students will learn ways people can protect themselves from infection with serious blood borne communicable diseases.

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
