State Performance Plan (SPP) Indicators - In 2004, the IDEA was reauthorized to align more closely with the Elementary and Secondary Education Act's (ESEA) standards of accountability. The IDEA required that each state develop a six-year **State Performance Plan (SPP)** for special education and early intervention programs. The SPP is comprised of indicators that measure the state's performance on these indicators.

The indicators can be classified into two types: results indicators, which have targets set by each state, and compliance indicators, which have targets set by the Office of Special Education programs (at either 100 percent or 0 percent).

Each year Michigan gathers data from school districts and other sources for each indicator. These data are compiled into an **Annual Performance Report (APR)**, which summarizes Michigan's progress toward the state and federally established targets.

Public Reporting – The IDEA requires states to publicly report each school district's performance in meeting the targets for specific indicators. For 2011 public reporting, states are required to report state and **district performance** on the following indicators:

- 1. Graduation
- 2. Dropout
- 3. Statewide Assessment
- 4. Suspension/Expulsion
- 5. Educational Environments (least restrictive environment)
- 7. Preschool Outcomes
- 8. Facilitated Parent Involvement
- 9. Disproportionate Representation—Child with a Disability
- 10. Disproportionate Representation—Eligibility Category
- 11. Child Find
- 12. Early Childhood Transition

The State of Michigan Office of Special Education and Early Intervention Services (OSE-EIS) website makes it easy to access these public reports by intermediate school district (ISD) or by local school district. A click on the desired indicator yields a description of the indicator, the state's performance on the indicator, and the district's performance on the indicator, typically accompanied by a bar graph.
